POSITION SUMMARY:

This position supports the work of the Y, a leading nonprofit, charitable organization committed to strengthening community through youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. Under the direction of the Association Youth Director, and in accordance with the policies of the Door County YMCA, the Youth Sports Instructor will be responsible for implementing the lesson plan and providing supervision to program participants.

- 2. Assist Youth Director with distribution of information to participants and parents, formulation of curriculum and trainings. Direct all concerns to appropriate personnel if unable to address them adequately.
- 3. Provide an atmosphere where participants can have fun with emphasis on teamwork, sportsmanship, and listening skills among participants.
- 4. Incorporate character development into the curriculum that features the four YMCA core values: Caring, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility.
- 5. Educate oneself about the motor, psychological, and social development of an age group and tailor the teaching methods to be age appropriate.
- 6. Exemplify the YMCA values of Caring, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility in all aspects of job performance and in relationships with others.

- 5. Demonstrate skills in working with and motivating people in a positive manner.
